Tony Hinchcliffe

Tony works as a full-time artist from his studio in Northamptonshire. He takes a lot of his inspiration from his time spent in the outdoors, often in Scotland, Wales, Cornwall and more recently Sri Lanka. Tony exhibits and sells his work worldwide, recently exhibiting at the Royal society of Marine artists at the Mall Galleries.

The Workshop

We will work with big brushes in the initial stages finding the right colours and tones then picking out finer details of the flowers towards the end, working loose and splashing paint around to create a little more expression behind your mark making.

I will show you how light appears in your painting automatically when you paint in all the darker tones (an under painting) before you consider smaller details. A guide to composition with a focal point which may include just a few details on one or two flowers while keeping the overall theme loose and free....a time to use your imagination!!

What to bring

- ***If you can bring a selection of your favourite flowers that would be ideal, alternatively bring some photographic reference which we will use as a rough guide.***
- ***A jug or vase to use as a reference in your painting.***
- Canvas or canvas board, any size between A4 - A2. Bring some extra surfaces to practice and experiment. Thicker paper suitable for acrylic paint, canvas board, gesso brimmed MDF or ply wood. Sketching paper to make rough drawings.
- Soft pencil and sharpener, rubber.
- **Acrylic paint:** Ultramarine blue, Primary magenta, lemon yellow, Burnt umber, Titanium white.
If you have any other bright flowery colours bring them along.
- **Brushes:** Small medium and large, filbert or flats - keep old brushes as they will always have a use to create a particular texture or edge!
- If you have a 1 inch and a 1/2 inch soft decorating brush that would be great.
- Pallet knife. Pallet - piece of ceramic tile or plastic tray would work. Kitchen roll. Mist sprayer.

What's provided

- Drawing boards, Table Easels, Water pots, Hairdryers
- Acrylic and sketching paper available to purchase at the studio
